# ORDINANCE #01-2022 - AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEREA, KENTUCKY, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BEREA, KENTUCKY, BY ADDING SECTION 31.315, PROHIBITING WASTEWATER TREATMENT SERVICE TO ANY PRIVATE COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY OUTSIDE OF THE CORPORATE LIMITS. - 1<sup>ST</sup> READING

Corporate Counsel, Gilbert, read Ordinance #01-2022 in entirety.

#### CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT - R. Beverly

 Andrea Walker, Channel 27, Lexington, had visited Tourism / Old Town. She interviewed Liz Todd, Tourism's Program Manager, regarding the LearnShops and featured the interview on the noon news. A great promotion for the LearnShop program.

- Old Town shops reported an outstanding Christmas season. Sales were higher for 2021 than they had been in 2019 (pre-pandemic). Donna Angel, Business & Tourism Development Director, and her team had also worked hard to promote the City's small businesses.
- Requested Council's approval for a budget overage for the following line item:

#010-6005-54500 Building and Grounds R&M, for the Parks Department Overage of \$19,945, amending the amount to \$30,000

The available balance was \$2400 (originally budgeted for \$30,000).

Due to an emergency water leak in the ballpark / stadium area, an entire water line needed to be replaced, approximately 2000 ft. The cost to the City was \$22,345, creating a budget overage of \$19,945. Increasing the amount to \$30,000 would allow payment for the contractor, leaving the Park approximately \$10,000 for repairs if other issues arose prior to budget amendment(s) in March.

Caudill motioned; Payne seconded motion, with the Council's acknowledgement, to approve overage of \$19,945 for line item #010-6005-54500 (Building and Grounds R&M) with the intent of a budget amendment in March.

#### **ORDINANCE** #\_\_01\_\_ - 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEREA, KENTUCKY, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BEREA, KENTUCKY, BY ADDING SECTION 31.315, PROHIBITING WASTEWATER TREATMENT SERVICE TO ANY PRIVATE COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY OUTSIDE OF THE CORPORATE LIMITS AND WHICH IS ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TO THE CITY BOUNDARIES

WHEREAS, There are pockets of unincorporated area adjacent to or contiguous with the city corporate boundaries which are likely to ultimately be developed for commercial or industrial purposes; and

WHEREAS, In the event of such development, such areas will require city services such as sidewalks and utilities, including wastewater collection and treatment; and

WHEREAS, it is reasonable to require that any such areas requiring such municipal services be within the corporate limits so that such areas pay their fair share of the costs of providing municipal services;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Berea, Kentucky, that the Code of Ordinances of the City of Berea be revised as follows:

#### SECTION I

That the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to add Section 31.315, and such section shall read as follows:

### § 31.315 CONNECTIONS TO SEWAGE SYSTEM PROHIBITED TO COMMERCIAL OR INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY OUTSIDE CITY LIMITS.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, which owns or occupies commercial or industrial property, or property intended for commercial or industrial use, located outside the corporate limits of the city, and adjacent to or contiguous with city boundaries, to connect, cause to be connected or permit to be connected, any sanitary sewer lateral or main to the sewer system of the city.

(b) The Municipal Sewer System shall not provide or permit any sewer connection or capacity increase for any commercial or industrial property, or property intended

for commercial or industrial use, located outside the corporate limits of the city, and adjacent to or contiguous with city boundaries, or any commercial, non-industrial BMU sewer customers outside of the corporate limits, and adjacent to or contiguous with city boundaries.

(c) The provisions is subsections (a) and (b) above shall not apply to property owned or occupied by any governmental or quasi-governmental entity.

#### **SECTION II**

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed. This	
ordinance shall be published according to law.
