CITY ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT - R. Beverly

- Mayor Fraley coordinated with the Kentucky League of Cities (KLC) and Mayor Smiley of Dawson Springs, Kentucky, to assist them in their tornado recovery efforts. Mayor Fraley tasked with the Berea Police Department, the Public Works Department, and the Berea Fire Department obtaining resources the City could donate. Steve Collins (Public Works Dept.) and Sam Shearer (Police Dept.) drove to Dawson Springs delivering various collected items and City stock items, i.e., signs, generators, chainsaws, etc. The Mayor, Police Chief, and Public Works Director of Dawson Springs were pleased with the donations and expressed gratitude to all of Berea for their support.
- Berea Police and Fire Departments were hosting Foley Middle School's Moderate and Severe Disabilities (MSD) Classroom on February 11th. The classroom consisted of educational lessons introducing Police & Fire to the students, Police & Fire getting to know the students, and assisting in reducing anxiety when responding to emergencies with Police & Fire responders. As this would be an ongoing relationship, it would be the beginning of a new partnership within the City of Berea and part of the Police Department's Berea CARES initiative.
- Donna Angel, Business & Tourism Development Director, announced Popeye's Chicken would be opening in Berea. Official ribbon cuttings were taking place this week at Honeysuckle Dining & Bourbon House at Churchill's and at Bad Wolf Gaming.
- Although there had been numerous delays over the course of the past year and a half, a final walkthrough inspection was scheduled for Tuesday, February 2nd, for the Walnut Meadow Pump Station and South Middletown Sewer Trunkline Project. Berea Municipal Utilities thanked staff, engineers, contractors, and sewer customers that had been a part of the extremely important project. The total cost of the project was \$2,311,340 and was partially funded by a \$1 Million Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and a \$500,000 Kentucky Infrastructure Authority (KIA) grant.

MAYOR'S REPORT / COMMENTS

- Echoed Rose Beverly's, City Administrator, thank you to everyone involved in donating items to Dawson Springs' tornado victims.
- A City Council Work Session was scheduled for February 15th, prior to the City Council Meeting. Greyson Evans, Bluegrass Area Development District (BGAD), would be reporting on the American Relief Plan Act (ARPA), the final rule issued on January 6, 2022.

Payne Parks & Rec Department had a meeting on Thursday, January 27th. Master Plan survey results were reviewed / discussed and future Master Plan meetings would be scheduled. Parks Maintenance positions had become available, get your applications submitted.

Mayor Fraley acknowledged the efforts of the community members on the steering committee for Parks & Rec and commented that Parks Director, Priscilla Bloom, had done an outstanding job of coordinating and bringing people together.

Davis asked Howard, General Manager, Berea Municipal Utilities, to report on dirt pile at the intersection of HWY 21 and Shortline Pike.

Howard reported that the dirt pile located at HWY 21 and Shortline Pike was from the utility relocates for the bypass which included Delta Gas, Southern Madison Water, Berea Municipal Utilities Water, Sewer, & Electric. As conflict had resulted with other underground utilities, Howard had spoken with the Kentucky Department of Transportation's contractor, at the end of 2021, who had received a verbal approval change order request from the state and was waiting on written approval. As of today, February 1st, the contractor continued to wait on written approval. Once the written approval was received, he would return to finish the work. With the contractor's approval, Howard was willing to remove part of the dirt for better visibility at the intersection.

New businesses were opening in and/or coming to town, i.e., Honeysuckle Dining & Bourbon House, Soak City car wash, Popeyes, Scooter's Coffee, and Bad Wolf Gaming. Angel, Business & Tourism Development Director, continued to pursue a grocery store.

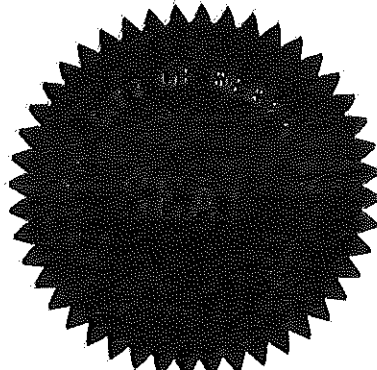
Whereas, the Village to Village network celebrates February 15, 2022 as National Village Day, and

ORDINANCE # 02 - 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BERA, KENTUCKY, AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF BERA, KENTUCKY, BY REVISING SECTION 40.306, TO REQUIRE THAT CURBS MARKING FIRE HYDRANTS SHALL BE PAINTED RED, AND PROHIBITING PARKING WITHIN FIVE FEET OF ANY DRIVEWAY, WITHIN TWELVE FEET IN FRONT OF A RESIDENTIAL MAILBOX, OR ON BRIDGES OR OVERPASSES; AND FURTHER REPEALING THE TEN HOUR PARKING PROHIBITION IN SECTION 40.308(B).

WHEREAS, the City Council periodically reviews the Code of Ordinances for out-dated provisions and provisions requiring revision; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that provisions of the Traffic Code regulating parking are in need of revision;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Berea, Kentucky, that the Code of Ordinances of the City of Berea be revised as follows:

SECTION I

That the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to revise Section 40.306, so that such section shall read as follows:

§ 40.306 PARKING IN CERTAIN LOCATIONS PROHIBITED

No person shall stop, stand, or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or in compliance with the directions of a police officer or traffic control device, in any of the following places:

- (A) On any sidewalk, parkway, or utility strip between the street and sidewalk;
- (B) At any place where the vehicle would block the use of any driveway;
- (C) Within any intersection;
- (D) Within ten (10) feet of a fire hydrant (Curbs marking the location of fire hydrants shall be painted red);
- (E) In or upon any crosswalk;
- (F) Alongside or opposite any street, excavation or obstruction, when such stopping, standing or parking would obstruct traffic;
- (G) On the roadway side of any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;
- (H) At any place where official signs or markings prohibit stopping, standing or parking;
- (I) Within twenty (20) feet of the driveway entrance to any fire department station;

- (J) Within twenty (20) feet of a traffic signal, beacon, or sign on the approaching side;
- (K) Within twenty five (25) feet of any intersection;
- (L) Within thirty (30) feet of the nearest rail of a railroad grade crossing;
- (M) With the left side of the vehicle next to the curb, except on one-way streets;
- (N) On any private property without the consent of the owner of the property, if the owner has posted a sign prohibiting or regulating parking.
- (O) In a parking area designated for the use of a person with a disability pursuant to KRS 189.459, without displaying the registration plate or placard referred to in such statute;
- (P) Within five (5) feet of any driveway;
- (Q) Within twelve (12) feet of any residential mailbox; provided, however, that a resident will be permitted to park in front of his or her own mailbox so long as other mailboxes are not blocked by doing so;
- (R) On bridges or overpasses, including railroad bridges or overpasses.

SECTION II

That the Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to revise Section 40.308, so that such section shall read as follows:

§ 40.308 SCHEDULE OF STREETS WITH LIMITED PARKING TIME

(A) *Two-hour parking.* It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle for a longer period of time than two (2) hours, during the hours indicated, upon the following streets or portions of streets, except on Sundays and legal holidays:

ORDINANCE NO. 03 - 2022

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BEREА, KENTUCKY, ANNEXING CERTAIN REAL PROPERTY LOCATED NEAR BEREА, MADISON COUNTY, KENTUCKY.

WHEREAS, Kathleen Newby via an Affidavit of Descent of Ruth J. Roberts, is the owner of a certain tract of land located at 1112 Mayde Road, Berea, Madison County, Kentucky, which currently lies outside of the city limits of the City of Berea; and

WHEREAS, Kathleen Newby has requested the property located at 1112 Mayde Road, containing 27.69 acres, more or less, be annexed into the City of Berea; and

WHEREAS, the City of Berea has determined that the annexation would be beneficial to the City; and

WHEREAS, the City will be in the position to extend certain municipal services to said property; and

WHEREAS, the owner of the land agrees to the annexation;

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of Berea, Kentucky does ordain as follows:

SECTION I

That the City of Berea, Kentucky, pursuant to KRS 81A.412 and KRS 81A.420, hereby annexes and makes a part of the corporate area certain real property located at 1112 Mayde Road, Berea, Kentucky, as more particularly described in the attached Exhibit A, consisting of a plat and a metes and bounds property description.

SECTION II

Pursuant to KRS 81A.412, the property annexed herein is designated I-2 (Industrial Park District), inasmuch as the property is surrounded by such classification.

SECTION III

Upon the enactment of this ordinance, the territory described in Section I is part of the City of Berea for all purposes.

SECTION IV

The City Clerk or any other officer having custody of official maps or records of the City is hereby directed to amend such maps or records to reflect the annexation and zoning classification provided for and assigned herein.

SECTION V

All ordinance or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
